



Stacking Bricks

Finished Size: 38 ½" x 42 ½"

Fabric Requirements:

- 1 charm pack or 34 colored 5" squares or scraps
- 1 yard neutral background
- ¾ yard border/binding
- 1 ½ yard backing or scrap it together like we did!

Cutting Instructions:

From each charm square or your scraps:

Cut a total of 68- 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles

From neutral background:

Cut 12- 2 ½" x WOF strips


Subcut 8 strips into a total of 51- 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles and 17 2 ½" squares

From Brown Border/Binding Fabric:

Cut 9- 2 ½" x WOF strips


Sewing Instructions:

- Using 1 neutral 2 ½" square, 3 neutral 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles, and 4 colored 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles, make a row alternating colored and neutral rectangles. Add a neutral 2 ½" square to one end of the strip. Repeat to make 17 rows.



- Create the center of the quilt by alternating the 17 rows created in step 1. The odd numbered rows will have the neutral squares to the right while the even numbered rows will have the neutral square to the left.





3. Join the remaining 4 neutral background strips. Measure your quilt vertically through the middle. Cut two segments to this measurement. Attach to opposite sides of the quilt. Press to the border. Measure your quilt horizontally through the middle. Cut two segments to this measurement. Attach to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press to the border.
4. Join the 9 brown 2 ½" strips. Measure your quilt vertically through the middle. Cut two segments to this measurement. Attach to opposite sides of the quilt. Press to the border. Measure your quilt horizontally through the middle. Cut two segments to this measurement. Attach to the top and the bottom of the quilt. Press to the border.
5. Quilt.
6. Bind using the remaining length of brown border/binding fabric.
7. The fabric that we used to make this quilt was remnants from another quilt that we designed and made. After completing both quilts, we still had a small amount of fabric from the line left which we wanted to use up in the backing of this quilt. To create the special backing, we cut the remnants into 2 ½" segments of varying lengths, ranging from 2 ½" to 5". We joined these together to create a total of 6 strips of at least 45" each. We joined these strips together and added a neutral strip to the outer edges of the pieced section. Because of the multitude of seams, we pressed the center panel using a small amount of spray starch. We added background fabric to each side of the fabric to bring it to a backing that was approximately 45" long and 45" wide.

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
